


Under the umbrella of Positive and Inclusive Education, we offer many wellbeing initiatives that all focus on the emotional wellbeing of our students including:

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Our school is committed to a holistic approach to student learning. Our Inclusion and Wellbeing Framework brings together the science of Positive Psychology with best practice teaching to encourage and support our students, our school, and our wider community to thrive. We refer to thriving as a combination of **'feeling good and doing good'**.

Our Inclusion and Wellbeing Framework focuses on specific skills that assist students to strengthen their relationships, build positive emotions, enhance personal resilience, promote mindfulness, and encourage a healthy lifestyle. Our Thrive Matrix embeds this into our core school values of responsibility, respect, personal excellent and curiosity. Students are encouraged to have a strong vision for their futures as well as being instrumental in informing the future visions for our school.















We accept enrolments at any time throughout the 2024 school year. To support planning for the 2025 school year, we like to **finalise this process throughout Education Week**, which begins on Monday May 13th. The school offers private tours and information sessions by appointments. Simply contact the school to make a time. Children who reach the age of five by April 30th 2025, may commence school at the beginning of the 2025 school year.



In Term 4, all students enrolled in Prep for 2025 will be visiting our school regularly to attend special transition sessions. The children will get to experience the many different aspects of school and build relationships with their 2025 classmates and Year 6

Buddy.

Term 1, 2025





Children in Prep follow a special program early in the 2025 school year. Children are not required to attend school on Wednesdays for the beginning of Term 1. This is a **REST Day**, where children can **'recharge'** from the busy requirements of school. However, families may be asked to bring children into the school for some informal assessment tasks on these Wednesdays.

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Regular attendance ensures smooth student progress and helps with positive social development. Regular attendance will help your child develop: important skills and knowledge to help them learn; socially, emotionally and academically. It also helps build independence, resilience and teamwork.



Absence

The Department of Education requires parents to provide written explanation for the absence of their child. It is important that students develop good habits of punctuality and regular attendance.

Late Arrival

All children must be walked into school by a parent/guardian and report to the office if they are late.

Early Departure

If children are leaving school early for an appointment or any other reason, they must be first signed out at the office by a parent/guardian. A bus note must also be completed at the office (if they travel on the bus).

Individual Student Information and Emergency Contact

Personal information and emergency contact numbers are kept for each child at the school. It is important that the school has your current personal and emergency contact information. If this information changes, please notify the school immediately.

Reporting on student and School learning growth

Parent/Teacher interviews are held throughout the year to discuss individual student's academic and social progress. Written reports are available on XUNO at the end of Semester 1 and Semester 2 and provide written feedback on student achievement against the Victorian curriculum.

Annual reporting by the Principal and School Council occurs at the School Council Annual General Meeting, which is held in March. All families are welcome to attend this meeting.

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Classrooms

There are many special opportunities to visit our classrooms to see what is happening. Children love to have parents and relatives come into their learning environment to share all the wonderful things they are learning/doing.



Nullawarre and District Primary School is committed to providing opportunities to develop and extend each child to their full potential by offering sound and current learning experiences along with a range of educational, physical, and social proficiencies. *Our key focus is on developing the whole child, both academically as well as socially and emotionally.*

Literacy and Numeracy are an essential part of our daily learning and teaching. Fundamental skills and concepts are developed in focused teaching sessions, and these areas are then integrated with other learning spotlights to inform our Inquiry Learning approach.



We are so fortunate to be able to offer a wide range of specialist learning experiences for students to complement their core learning. Our students develop into well-rounded learners through STEAM, MARC Van Library, Respectful Relationships, and Japanese Language sessions. They also have numerous opportunities to contextualise their learning through extra-curricular experiences including camps, performances, water safety (swimming lesson P-3 and open water 4-6), winter sports and a variety of hands-on and exciting excursions/incursions.





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STEAM & Agriculture

STEAM is an educational approach to learning that uses Science, Technology, Engineering, the Arts and Mathematics as access points for guiding student inquiry, dialogue, and critical thinking. The end results are students who take thoughtful risks, engage in experiential problem solving, learning. persist in embrace collaboration and work through the creative process. We are developing the innovators, educators, leaders, and learners of the 21st Century!



At Nullawarre and District Primary School, all students from Prep to Year Six are engaged in an extensive Agricultural Program, which is contextualised through our Literacy, Numeracy and STEAM learning areas. Our friendly chooks: Pecky, Karen, Wendy and Brittney provide lots of opportunities for fun hands-on learning. We are proud to partner with many of our local farms and draw on the expertise of our families and community members to engage students in the wide variety of pathways in dairy. A focus of this program is our calf program throughout Term 2 where each classroom has the responsibility of rearing calves and learning from them. Students also experience excursions, incursions, guest speakers, and a wide variety of other learning opportunities.





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Nullawarre & District Primary School's uniform consists of navy polar fleece jumpers or windcheaters and polo shirts. Clothing items can be purchased through Directwear or Hip Pocket at any time throughout the year (please see the school for further details). Alternatively, navy shorts, tracksuit pants and summer dresses are available from local stores and suppliers. All clothing MUST be marked with the child's name. It is recommended that all young students wear shoes that are fastened with Velcro or a buckle if they cannot tie shoelaces.

Our school is a **Sun Smart School** and as such requires students to wear a wide-brimmed school hat whilst outside from the beginning of September through to the end of April or whenever UV levels reach three or more. Those students without a hat are required to play in a designated shaded area. **School Sun Hats** can be purchased for \$15 at the office.

Second-Hand Uniforms

Second-hand uniforms are available in many sizes for a small donation. Please contact the school to see what is available.

School Bags

Strong and practical school bags can be purchased from the office for \$45.

Lost Property

Any lost property is placed in the lost property basket located in the office. If items are labelled, they will be returned to the owner. Please label all clothing and food containers to avoid things going missing.

Out of Uniform Days

On occasion, the school will host out of uniform days. It is vital that on these days students still maintain an appropriate dress level. Thongs or open-toed shoes or singlet tops are unsuitable for school wear.









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Car Parking – Dropping and Collecting Children

There is a safe car park at the front of the school. Please do not drive through or park in the bus lane. Students always enter and exit the school from the safety gate between the school and the kindergarten.



Safe Bus Routes To and From School

Families are required to see their child safely onto the bus in the morning and are required to be waiting at the bus stop at the end of the day. Students will not be allowed to get off the bus at their stop if there is no one waiting there for them. The student will remain on the bus and return to school after the bus run. The bus cannot wait for you. Parents should be waiting on the correct side of the road and must not encourage children to cross the road to

Our **Outside School Hours Care** is operated by TheirCare. Our Service Coordinator is providing an amazing program both before school and after school for our students.

The before-school care program operates from 7.00am to 8.45am and includes breakfast (on request).

The after-school care program operates from 3.30pm to 6.00pm each afternoon and includes a nutritious afternoon tea.

Both programs offer a daily plan of activities that are play-based, childcentred, and inclusive experiences, focusing on the developmental, social, and recreational needs of all the children.
